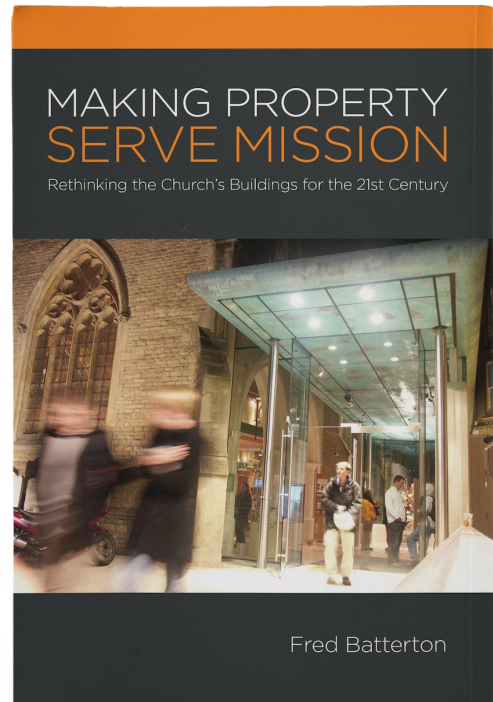
Batterton has a thorough "how to" list: professionals who may be able to help, processes and plans. Above all a "re-purposive" that looks to the future with hope and confidence.
