How does it work?

The church leader sets the scene with resources, seminars and preaching about vision and local mission calling.



What is it?

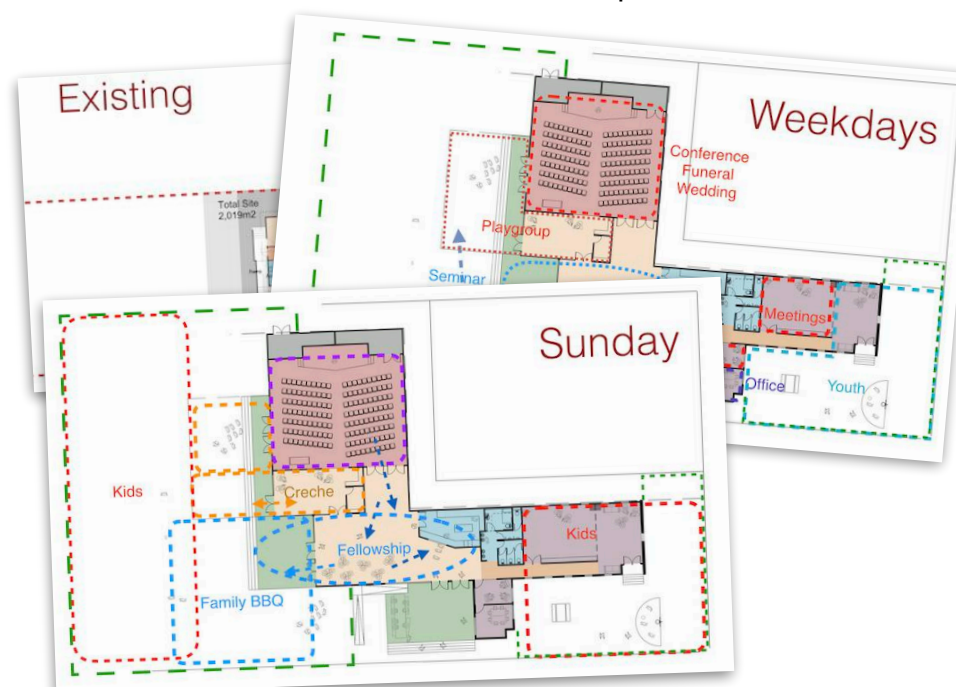
Missional Identity (MiD) is an online service for church communities to gain consensus on their own specific Mission.

Missional Masterplanning takes the results of MiD and asks leaders to review the church's buildings and land to see how successfully they enable that mission

A building solution is then designed and work-shopped to improve the church's mission facilities.

Two questionnaires follow. The first, which can be sent to all members, asks around 80 questions about present and future mission priorities. The second uses output from the first and asks leaders how well the shortlisted mission priorities are enabled by the current property.

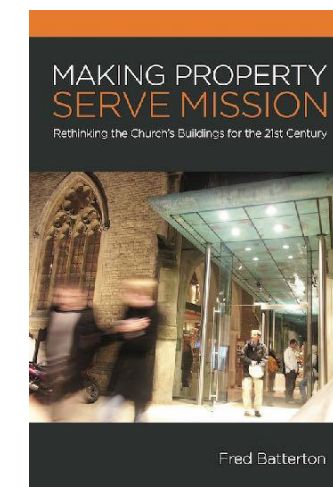
These results are then added to demographics and any declared needs to create a property strategy. Architects skilled in improving church facilities then prepare an outline design solution. This is presented for workshop discussion, costed and finalised. An illustrated on-screen presentation follows.



What are the deliverables?

1. Your church's Missional Identity (MiD). This identifies your primary focus.
2. A self-critical and an architect's assessment of your current building's effectiveness in supporting your mission.
3. A property analysis and strategy with opportunities identified.
4. Design master plan and workshop.
5. Final design masterplan.
6. On-screen presentation with findings and scheme with costing and staging.
7. Action plan towards implementation including permits and construction.
