
Reality Check

Are you part of a church that meets in buildings that have been in use for a long time? Are they effective in enabling the core business of your church in society today? Has it passed its use-by date? Here are a few tell-tale signs:

- Apathy or lack of urgency about mission.
- Frustration about excessive activity or lack of it on church property.
- Members disagree about change so nothing happens.
- · Outdated buildings and grounds.
- No agreement on where we should concentrate our efforts.

There is a solution: clarify your own church's specific mission and then see how your property can support it. We have developed a process over several years called Missional Identity (MiD) that will:

- · Engage people in mission thinking.
- · Develop unity and avoid diversions.
- Enable leaders to know what their members think.

- · Create a shortlist of mission priorities that has consensus in your church.
- Evaluate your property in service of that mission.

Following this the Missional Masterplanning (MM) service provides a clear way forward:

- Develop a strategy for property changes: Improve / Redeploy / Acquire / Replace
- · A design is prepared based on your agreed mission.
- A workshop process with an architect can refine the design proposals.
- Consider cost and funding.
- Provide a final presentation to the whole church with a plan to implement.
